Like all Americans, I was horrified to wake up on the morning of March 26 to the images of the collapse of the Francis Scott Key Bridge over the Patapsco River in Baltimore after being struck by the container ship, *Dali*. This tragedy is difficult for all who work to

protect public health, safety, and welfare, as civil engineers do. It especially hits home for anyone that has found themselves wearing a safety vest, hard hat, and PPE during nighttime lane closures of a roadway project. I pray for the victims and their families. God bless the first responders. We will surely learn a great deal from this horrible accident. There is no doubt that the civil engineering and construction communities will rise to the occasion to recover from this tragedy, reopen the Port of Baltimore, and rebuild the bridge over the Patapsco River.

As we come to grips with the heartbreak in Baltimore, we look forward to April for the ASCE St. Louis Section. It is important to honor the people that have led the way in our profession. We will do just that at our April Luncheon on Wednesday, April 10 when we honor **11 new life members**. These individuals have contributed to the Civil Engineering profession for a

### 2024 ASCE Legislative Fly-In



On February 28-29, more than 250 ASCE members from 47 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico, attended the 2024 Legislative Fly-In in Washington D.C. Dennis Boll and ASCE President Marsia Geldert-Murphey participated from the St. Louis Section, along with **Otto Lynch** from Springfield, and **Bayley Brooks** and **Danny Hotson** from Kansas City. The event started at the Hyatt Regency Capitol Hill with a welcome address from Marsia, a keynote presentation from U.S. Representative Rick Larson (WA-02), and National Journal Editor in Chief Jeff Dufour, and a panel discussion on Building for the Future, developing resilient infrastructure. Day 2 started with a keynote from Sarah Kapnick, Chief Scientist with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and panel discussions with Biden administration officials. In the afternoon, we walked to Capitol Hill and met with Senators

and Representatives of Missouri, where we shared our civil engineering experiences and issues briefings on Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) reauthorizations, building resilient infrastructure, and finding and educating engineers for the future. We capped off the day at a reception regaling our stories from our Capitol visits.


